About Gyeongju

Gyeongju, a thousand-year-old city, is the crown jewel of Korea's rich cultural heritage. The entire city is an open-air museum known as "the museum without walls" because of the vast number of cultural properties and archaeological sites of the city.

Located in the southeastern part of Korea, Gyeongju served as the capital of the Silla Kingdom (57 BC – AD 935), which was ruled by 56 kings over 992 years, the longest period of any dynasty in the history of Korea. Over the course of almost a thousand years, Silla transformed itself from a small tribal nation to a kingdom occupying more than half of the Korean Peninsula. Among such historical treasures, Seokguram grotto, Bulguksa temple, Gyeongju Historic Areas and Yangdong Folk Village are designated as World Heritage Sites by UNESCO.

Conference Venue (HICO)
